## Background

#### Since 2005 Operations from:

- British Virgin Islands [twice]
  - VP2V / AB4U
- Belize [twice]
  - V31BU with V31JM & V31CL
- South Texas
  - WA5FAC
- Florida Panhandle [several times]
  - AB4U/P
- Sint Maarten [Now Country St. Martin]
  - PJ7A & PJ7 / AB4U

### Purpose

- Most trips with my good friend John Mathis, WA5FAC
- Each year since the 1990s, John & I spend a week or two together traveling / exploring
- Most trips originated as his idea..."Why don't we..."
- For years we spent time cruising the Chesapeake Bay.
  In the last 10 years we have broadened our adventure destinations.
- Trips were always for vacation purposes such as a desire to sail someplace new or just because we wanted to see some place that we had heard about
- Ham Radio came along for fun never as the primary objective

### Licensing Issues

- If local license / call desired or needed
  - START EARLY; At least 6 months; 9 months would be better
  - That you are in a hurry to get licensed is not their problem!
- ARRL website is good source of info
  - So are Hams who have done it <u>recently</u>
  - Things change Contacts & Rules
  - Another Reason to Start Early
- Follow Instructions and Follow Up
- Nothing more than CEPT May be Needed
  - You can print out that authority yourself
  - Print the needed documents at home before leaving on the trip and keep them with the radio

## British Virgin Islands

- No local calls issued to visiting Hams
  - Call issued was VP2V / AB4U
- Start early
  - "What's your hurry mon?"
- Our operation was always from sailboats so did not count for DXCC
- Interesting what you can hear

### Belize

- Local License Required
- Send request for info & why you want to be licensed
- You will need:
  - Application [letter request]
  - Copy of US Ham Radio License
  - Copy of US Passport
  - Application dollars
    - International Money orders are a pain because you have to deal with the US Post Office
- You will need an Import Authorization to get your radio through Belize Customs

### Belize

- 1<sup>st</sup> operation from "resort" in Dangriga
  - WA5FAC, W4KZK, W4LKF, AB4U
  - FT-897D, FT-817, dipoles & long wires
  - Operated a lot but not constantly; good results
- 2<sup>nd</sup> operation from Placentia and on & off from a sailboat; stuck ashore due to bad WX
  - WA5FAC, W4KZK, AB4U
  - FT-857D, FT-817, dipole & vertical
- V3 call is like having an amplifier!

### South Texas

- Stayed at private lodge in Kenedy County
  - Nothing higher than a Mesquite tree
- Storms, snakes, African wildlife and good food
  - Site of my award winning photo in QST and 2012 Calendar
- Famous King Ranch nearby
- Landscape not attractive but if you own land there, you're set...natural gas wells & cattle [25 to 1]
- Nothing in Kenedy County...almost an hour to the grocery store or restaurant
- Elecraft KX1 & Dipole

### Panama City Beach

- 3<sup>rd</sup> floor condo near beach
- Tried many antenna ideas, settled on 20m dipole hung vertically
- Also used remote base [rigs in Roanoke]
- Site of GMRA Radio Camp
  - WA5FAC, W4KZK, AB4U
  - Dedicated week to fix, rebuild & work on older radios
  - Also Operate newer rigs, eat good sea food & explore
- Great Operating results with vertical dipole plus VHF & UHF antennas using FT-897 & TS-830s


## Sint Maarten / Saint Martin

- PJ7 / AB4U in Oct 2011
  - CEPT license
  - French Side of same island has same licensing scheme but different call
- FT-817 & end-fed 20m Zepp
  - Time share condo; Antenna Limitations
  - Not Practical as guest in someone else's condo
  - Made only 6 contacts...3 CW & 3 PSK31
- Also guest operated PJ7A in 2010
  - Only made 10 contacts due to circumstances
